Women in STEM Lesson Plan

Overview: Research women in STEM (specifically space fields) and use this to rewrite Disney songs to teach about the importance of gender equality in the field. Connect to my love for music by recording myself singing my songs and playing ukulele. Use the videos as a basis for an educational program about the need to promote women in STEM, designed for a 1st grade Girl Scout troop. I will also explain that by teaching/learning in a creative way, people can learn more. I will show my videos, create fact sheets about women they can learn about, and help them complete their own creative projects to teach about the person they choose. They can then share with the group to demonstrate the importance of teaching in an engaging way.
